Leadership: Reforming Health Care Systems
How does leadership improve healthcare?
We define the ability to influence as the foundation of our definition of healthcare leadership. Healthcare leadership is the ability to effectively and ethically influence others for the benefit of individual patients and populations.

PCC: Patient Reported Outcome Measures (PROMs)
Why Reported Outcome Measures (PROMs) is important?
Patient Reported Outcome Measures (PROMs) assess the quality of care delivered to the National Health Service (NHS), patients from the patient perspective.

Module 3

Patient Safety: Investigating Serious Incidents
What is a serious incident investigation?
Patient safety incidents are any unintended or unexpected incident which could have, or did, lead to harm for one or more patients receiving healthcare. Reporting them supports the National Health Service (NHS) to learn from mistakes and to take action to keep patients safe.

Module 4

QI: What is QI in healthcare?
Quality improvement is the framework used to systematically improve care. Quality improvement seeks to standardize processes and structure to reduce variation, achieve predictable results, and improve outcomes for patients, healthcare systems, and organizations.

Module 5

HIT: Using HIT to Improve Patient Safety
How can we use HIT to improve patient safety?
The potential to improve patient safety exists through the use of: medication alerts, clinical flags and reminders, better tracking and reporting of consultations and diagnostic testing, clinical decision support and the availability of complete patient data.

Module 6

Accreditation: Developing Evaluating Standards
What does accreditation mean to healthcare institutions? Why is it important?
Provides a framework for the organizational structure and management. Helps improve patient safety and minimize the risk of near misses, adverse outcomes, and medical errors. Enhances community confidence in the quality and safety of care provided.
